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## SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES November 20, 2014

- **Attendance:** Selectmen –Bruce Rozett and Darryl Hubbard; Residents and Guest –Bonnie Lord, Willard Boothby, Ron Phinney, and Roxanne Herrick.
- **Selectman Rozett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.**
- **Selectmen Meeting Minutes:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to approve the November 13, 2014 Selectmen Meeting Minutes, second by Selectman Rozett and vote unanimous.
- **Quilt Raffle:** Beverly Foss, Chairman of the Parade Committee, reported she had come up with the idea to do a quilt, which she thought would be quite an undertaking, to raise money for the 4<sup>th</sup> July parade. With a lot of assistance, encouragement, and help from many ladies of town she was able to do it. Ms. Foss wanted to tell who made the squares on the quilt: Teri Anderson, Candy Bradbury, Jane Braley, Nina Cleaves, Diane Crowe, Betty Disanza, Beverly Foss, Garol Goodwin, Anne Hall, Roxanne Herrick, Gemma Huntress, Elaine Lafreniere, Denise Laverriere, Gloria Martell, Diane Qualey, Donna Sawyer, Grace Sisson, Karen Souza, and Linda Tibbetts. The quilt was assembled by Beverly Foss and Gemma Huntress and machine quilted by Betty Disanza who donated her time and thread to do that. Ms. Foss wanted to give Gemma Huntress a big round of thanks for she was her cheerleader the whole time tell her it could be done. Everybody that made their square donated their own fabric and after expenses were paid, as of tonight, we made \$1,000 for the parade. Ms. Foss drew the winning ticket –Patty Childs.
- **Limington Christmas Toy Box:** Ms. Foss mentioned the new project they are onto is in the hall, the Limington Christmas Toy Box to help Limington families in need at Christmas. Barbara Tanguay had done this before for several years.
- **Weekend Backpack Project:** Selectman Hubbard asked if Beverly had heard from Joyce Foley about a food box in the lobby. Beverly mentioned on Fridays a group of folks from Limington come here and they bring food to pack around fifteen backpacks that go to children at the H.B. Emery School to take home for the weekend. Selectmen have agreed to allow that project to put a box in the hall for donations, so if you have any food donations for the Weekend Backpack Project there will be box in the hall.
- **Approval of Warrant #47:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to approve Warrant #47: Appropriations: \$235,261.16 and Payroll \$14,647.31 for a total of \$249,908.47 second by Selectman Rozett and vote unanimous.

**Purchase Order Requests:**

- **Snow & Ice:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to approve a purchase order request to pay Sanel \$172.87 for plow harness for plow truck#8, so moved by Selectman Rozett and vote unanimous.
- **Fire Dept.:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to approve a purchase order request to pay Sanel \$14.84 for dimmer switch for Engine 1, so moved by Selectman Rozett and vote unanimous.
- **Limington Youth League:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to approve a purchase order request to pay Wescott & Sons \$723.88 for service repairs and new batteries for the Leagues' two lawn tractors, so moved by Selectman Rozett and vote unanimous.

**Old and New Business:**

- **Compactor Update:** Selectman Hubbard reported the compactor at the Transfer Station is now operating and will be operating this weekend for recycling. There will be one silver bullet left down back for a week or two just in case someone gets caught short.
- **Bridge Update:** Selectman Hubbard mentioned the Limington-Steep Falls Bridge is now open and traffic is flowing wonderful.
- **Committee Openings:** The Town has openings on the following committees: Old Town Hall Preservation Committee, the Moy-Mo-Da-Yo Recreational Area Oversight Committee, and a member plus an alternate to the Saco River Corridor Commission. - **Limington Christmas Toy Box:** Selectman Rozett mentioned again the Limington Christmas Toy Box is now accepting applications from Limington families who need assistance to purchase gifts for their children. Applications are available at the Town Office. Please pick up a.s.a.p. and return to the office by December 2<sup>nd</sup>. If you are interested in helping Limington families in need at Christmas, gift ideas are available on cards at the Town Office. Just pick one or more up, purchase the gift specified on the card, and return it unwrapped to the box in the hall. We are also accepting monetary donations. - **Sale of Town Truck:** Selectman Rozett mentioned an ad was placed in the Shopping Guide where the Town is disposing of a piece of surplus equipment as required by the annual Town Meeting Warrant. Limington Selectmen are offering bids on one 1987 GMC Brigadere plow truck with plow wing and dump body. It may be seen at the Limington Municipal Complex and bids must be received in the Selectmen's Office by 5:00 p.m. on December 10<sup>th</sup> and they should be sealed and clearly marked "1987 GMS Plow Truck Bid". Selectman Rozett advised residents to check the Town web page on the Transfer Station to see what is allowed, what is not allowed, and what should be recycled.
- **Adjourn:** Selectman Hubbard made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:24 p.m., so moved by Selectman Rozett.
