SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES April 27, 2017

- **Attendance:** Selectmen –Emil Braley and Debra Black - (Jeff Amatrudo not present)
- Residents and Guest: Bonnie Lord, Willard Boothby, Jason Smith, Ben St. John, and Roxanne Herrick.
- **Selectman Braley called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.**
- **Selectmen Minutes:** Selectman Black made a motion to approve the Selectmen's Meeting minutes of April 20, 2017 as written, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Approval of Warrant # 17:** Selectman Black made a motion to approve Warrant #17 as written: Appropriations: \$13,266.93 - Payroll: \$9,384.98 for a total of \$22,651.91, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.

Purchase Order Requests:

- **Highway:** Selectman Black so moved the requests to: purchase 200 yards of 1 ½" gravel from P.Y Estes & Son for \$2,200; to pay Cornish Hardware \$227.94 for hydraulic oil for Mack and sweeper; and to pay S.A. McLean \$646.00 for 35 York rake tines, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Municipal Complex:** Selectman Black so moved the request to pay Metcalf's \$13.00 for two bales of hay, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Brush Removal:** Selectman Black so moved the request to pay Wescott & Sons \$320.00 for two small hand saws, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **E911 Signs:** Selectman Black so moved the request to purchase three private road signs from White Sign for \$59.00, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Snow & Ice:** Selectman Black so moved the request to pay Napa \$61.79 for parts to repair truck 6, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Fire/EMS:** Selectman Black so moved the request to purchase medical supplies from Bound Tree for \$422.05, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Old Town Hall:** Selectman Black so moved the request to purchase bathroom supplies and batteries from W.B. Mason for \$152.24, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Town Clerks Office:** Selectman Black so moved the request to pay Maine Municipal Association \$110.00 for two to attend a Municipal cash management workshop, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Limington Youth League:** Selectman Black so moved the request to reimburse Jay Twomey \$466.87 for field maintenance supplies; weed & feed, lime, rakes, diesel can, trash can, etc., second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.

Old and New Business:

- **MSAD# 6** hosts an annual turkey dinner for the senior citizens of the district each year. This dinner is free to any senior citizen residing in Buxton, Frye Island, Hollis, Standish and Limington. - **MSAD# 6 Reapportionment:** Selectman Braley reported he had attended the Monday meeting of the Reapportionment Committee and the final vote on the number of School Board Members went from 14 to 11 at large votes. Buxton and Standish have three votes each, Hollis and Limington have two votes each, and Frye Island has one vote. Members from each town will run in June and be on the June School Budget Referendum Ballot.

You will vote on all eleven members to the board. Willard Boothby, Bonnie Lord, Jason Smith, Ben St. John and Fausto Blasco asked questions which Selectmen Braley and Black answered.

- **Sanford Veteran Center's** Matthew Haley will hold another open house for veterans on May 19th at the Old Town Hall from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

- **MMDY:** MMDY will hold a beach cleanup day May 13th with a rain date of May 20th. They will be giving away free passes to those who help clean up for the day. Selectman Braley wanted to encourage everyone that uses the beach to help clean it up for the start of the summer season.

- **Meeting Open to Public:**

Jason Smith had questions concerning the Transfer Station attendants being told not to allow any commercial vehicles up there. Selectman Braley mentioned the cost of the Transfer Station is getting out of control and we have to find a solution. Commercial vehicles are not allowed. Conversation continued with Ben St. John suggesting the attendants shed have internet service so tracking permits would be easier.

Jason Smith had a question regarding grading South Road to get to the third field which the Youth League would like to make into a parking area. Selectman Braley mentioned that section of South Road is a private way and Municipal funds are not to be used on private ways. Conversation continued on the problems of the private way.

Willard Boothby spoke on Frye Island leaving the district and that the Town would not be able to afford it.

Fausto Blasco spoke on allowing commercial business to use the Transfer Station by charging, etc.

- **Motion to Adjourn:**

Selectman Black made a motion to adjourn at 8:05 p.m., second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
