## SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES July 6, 2017

• **Attendance:** Selectmen – Emil Braley, Jeff Amatrudo, and Debra Black.  
- Residents and Guest: Bonnie Lord, Shawn Girard, Ann Hall, Joyce Foley, Stanley Hackett, and Roxanne Herrick.

• **Selectman Braley called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.**

• **Selectmen Minutes:** Selectman Amatrudo made a motion to approve the Selectmen's Meeting minutes of June 29, 2017 as written, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

• **Approval of Warrant # 27:** Selectman Amatrudo made a motion to approve Warrant #27: Appropriations: \$22,828.29 - Payroll: \$9,110.50 for a total of \$31,938.79, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

### Purchase Order Requests:

Selectmen Braley read the following purchase order requests:

• **Limington Youth League:**

1. A request to reimburse Karen Twomey \$42.20 for equipment repair supplies from Sleeper's Supermarket & Hardware.
2. A request to pay Lake Region Pest Control \$190.00 for treatment to the fields.
3. A request to have Ray Martell take down 11 pine trees at the ballfield for \$1,500.00.

A motion to approve the Limington Youth League purchase orders as read was made by Selectman Amatrudo, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

• **Limington Youth League Donation Account:**

1. A request to reimburse Karen Twomey \$61.72 for the 225 movie night supplies.

A motion to approve the request by Selectman Amatrudo, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

• **Highway Dept.:**

1. A request to purchase wheel axle assembly, a wheel, tire and bearing assembly from Waterman Form & Machinery, Sabattus, Maine for \$292.00.
2. A request to pay Metcalf's \$96.50 for hay and grass seed.
3. A request to pay S.A. McLean \$1,800 for a Meyer shoulder conveyor.

A motion to approve the Highway Department purchase orders as read was made by Selectman Amatrudo, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

• **Old Town Hall:**

1. A request to pay Sleeper's Supermarket & Hardware \$5.47 for a flag clasp.

A motion to approve the request by Selectman Amatrudo, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

• **Fire/EMS Department:**

1. A request to pay Hartford Communication \$162.50 for wiring up a new power inverter on Engine 2.

2. A request to pay Maine State Federation of Firefighters \$420.00 for 28 membership dues. A motion to approve the Fire/EMS Department purchase orders as read was made by Selectman Amatrudo, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

### **Old and New Business:**

- **225 Celebration update:** Selectman Amatrudo said “Thank you,” to all the volunteers, sponsors, and those who donated time, goods, services and talents and especially everyone who came out to participate in the Limington 225 Celebration.
- **Present the result from the survey:** Selectman Amatrudo mentioned the Selectmen will present the results from the survey on town operations that was in with the town Ambulance Subscription form Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup> at their Selectmen Meeting at 7:00 p.m.
- **CIA Waste Management** owner, Shawn Girard apologized for the problems they have had lately with trash pick-up. His is having truck and driver problems. He did ask that trash be put out curbside by 7:30 a.m. as stipulated in the contract and that trash barrels should not weigh over 30 pounds. He did pick-up things this week which should go to the Transfer Station, a toilet, shower, etc., not beside the road. Mr. Girard asked that people please contact CIA Waste at 207-793-8193 or 207-937-8080 if they have any problems or questions with the trash pick-up.
- **Committee Openings:** The Town has openings on the following committees: Old Town Hall Preservation Committee, and the Planning Board. If interested in serving on either of these committees contact the Selectmen’s Office at 207-637-3105 or email at limington@roadrunner.com.
- **Moratorium on Recreational Marijuana:** Joyce Foley, Planning Board Chairman, mentioned the Planning Board has asked that the Selectmen set a moratorium on marijuana retail establishments and social clubs. She gave the Selectmen a copy of information gathered by Stanley Hackett on this issue and thanked Mr. Hackett for all the work he did in putting the information together.
- **Planning Board:** Joyce Foley, PLBD Chairman, mentioned there is a gentleman who would like to buy the gravel pit on Mildred Lane but it has become a dumping ground for tires, etc. She would like the Selectmen to consider waiving the fee to dispose of the tires. Selectmen mentioned there is no fee because the town does not take tires at the Transfer Station. Town money cannot be used to clean up private property.

Joyce mentioned the Planning Board is in need of a board member and two alternates; they have four members now and no alternates. The board should have five members and two alternates.

### **Informational Bulletin:**

- **Transfer Station hours** are Saturday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Wednesday 12-4 p.m. Recyclable materials go in the compactor at the Transfer Station. A town sticker is required for the disposal of metals, demolition, or brush.
- **General Assistance Office** is open Tuesday from 3 to 5 p.m. Applications are available from the Town Clerks office during their normal business hours and must be completed with supporting documentation and signed. Selectman Amatrudo reported that after next week the GA office will be open by appointment for the following three weeks.
- **Planning Board Meetings** are held on the first and third Tuesday evenings, 7:00 p.m. here at the Municipal Complex.
- **Financial Advisory Committee’s** will meet Monday, July 10th here in this room at 7:00 p.m.

• **Meeting Open to Public:**

Bonnie Lord asked for more information on the 11 trees to be taken down at the ballfield. Selectmen mentioned the pine trees are a hazard and are causing a negative effect on the fields themselves. Ms. Lord mentioned when she checks out the town website it is not always current. She would like to see the town get better at updating the site.

Selectman Black made a motion to adjourn at 7:42 p.m., second by Selectman Amatrudo and vote unanimous.
