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SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES

August 3, 2017

- **Attendance:** Selectmen – Emil Braley and Debra Black. (Jeff Amatrudo on vacation)
- Residents and Guest: Willard Boothby, Wander Whitten, Bonnie Lord, and Roxanne Herrick.
- **Selectman Braley called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.**
- **Selectmen Minutes:** Selectman Black made a motion to approve the Selectmen's Meeting minutes of July 27, 2017 as written, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Approval of Warrant # 31:** Selectman Black made a motion to approve Warrant #31: Appropriations: \$54,314.78 - Payroll: \$10,912.16 for a total of \$65,226.94, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.

Purchase Order Requests:

Selectmen Braley read the following purchase order requests:

- **Snow & Ice:** A request to pay Hydraulic Hose & Assemblies \$394.94 for parts to replace line to dump manifold & return on truck #14 and a request to pay Kezar Fall Napa \$74.54 for parts to repair truck #14 & 6, Selectman Black so moved a motion to approve the purchase order requests, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Parade Donation Acct:** A request to pay MMDY Summer Rec from the Parade Donation Account for one week at camp MMDY which was the prize for parade bike contest, Selectman Black so moved a motion to approve the purchase order request, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Highway Dept.:** A request to rent excavator and compactor from Herc Rentals for July, estimated cost \$4,250, Selectman Black so moved a motion to approve the purchase order request, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **MMDY Summer Rec:** A request to purchase three bottles of water from Poland Spring for \$33.87, Selectman Black so moved a motion to approve the purchase order request, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.
- **Fire/EMS Dept.:** A request to pay Sleepers Supermarket & Hardware \$19.27 for paint brushes, Selectman Black so moved a motion to approve the purchase order request, second by Selectman Braley and vote unanimous.

Old and New Business:

• **Weekly Update on Selectmen activities:**

Selectman Black reported Rep. Jonathan Kinney was in this week and brought in some information on the school budget and she needs to get over and speak with Bill Brockman about it. The State is giving back more money towards the school and we need to see how they are going to divvy it up.

The first-half of the property taxes are due in August and the girls in the office have been busy, they have collected 1.6 million dollars in taxes.

There is a sign-up for soccer and registrations are being done here at the Town office during regular business hours. Its \$30.00 for the first child and each additional child is \$20.00 each.

There was an abatement Selectmen handled tonight before the meeting.

Regarding trash pick-up, people need to make sure their trash is out by 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday's and Thursday's, the driver is coming earlier now. The curbside pick-up contract states, trash shall be curbside by 7:30 a.m. Selectman Braley mentioned since the meeting with Shawn, owner of CIA Waste, and after he came in and spoke at the Selectmen's Meeting, we have seen some good improvements. We think he has found a permanent driver now and if all can be a little patient, things are being worked out.

They will start to grind and pave Doles Ridge Road next week.

Selectmen expect the final engineer report for the culvert on Boothby Rd to be in next week, then it can be put out to bid.

The State is getting ready to pave Route 11 so be careful there.

We had one birthday this week in the office, she is 39 again.

Informational Bulletin:

- **Transfer Station hours** are Saturday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Wednesday 12-4 p.m. Recyclable materials go in the compactor at the Transfer Station. A town sticker is required for the disposal of metals, demolition, or brush.
- **General Assistance Office** will be open by appointment only for the next week and applications are available from the Town Clerks office during their normal business hours and must be completed with supporting documentation and signed.

Meeting Open to Public:

Bonnie Lord asked about the Boothby Road culvert and the DEP. Selectman Braley mentioned that Bair Engineering is engineering the work and getting the permits needed.

Willard Boothby asked if the school district received the million from the State. Selectman Black responded yes but she needs to see Bill Brockman to see how it will be distributed. Also, that the school board meetings are always open to the public and anyone interested may attend.

Bonnie Lord mentioned the Old Town Hall is not being used during the day. Selectman Braley mentioned they are trying to get ideas on how to promote recycling, and using the Old Town Hall more for community and senior activities, they just need to find some folks to put it all together. In regards to the recycling he feels a few signs to move around town to encourage and remind people to recycle might help.

Fausto Blasco mentioned Jason Smith was interested in doing a monthly movie night at the Old Town Hall.

Fausto Blasco voiced concerns regarding the signage compliances in the Zoning Ordinance for businesses. Selectman Braley mentioned this is a Planning Board and Code Enforcement issue. The Planning Board's next meeting will be August 15th where they will be discussing business signage in the business district.
