SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES November 2, 2017

PUBLIC HEARING: Winter road maintenance closures.

Attendance: Selectman: Emil Braley-Chairman, Jeff Amatrudo, and Debra Black; Jason Smith, Rick Staples and Roxanne Herrick.

Public Hearing was brought to order at 7:04 p.m. with the salute to the American Flag. Selectmen went over the portions of town roadways which would be closed to winter maintenance. Rich Staples had concerns on the closure of part of Mill Turn Road. Selectmen will amend the Mill Turn Road closure on this portion of roadway 350' upon an approved appropriate size turn-around being installed by property owner. Jason Smith spoke on the road closures.

Public Hearing was adjourned at 7:34 p.m.

- **Selectman Braley called the Selectmen's Meeting to order at 7:34 p.m.**
- **Selectmen Minutes:** Selectman Amatrudo made a motion to approve the October 26, 2017 Selectmen Minutes, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.
- **Approval of Warrant # 44:** Selectman Amatrudo made a motion to approve Warrant #44 as published: Appropriations: \$24,367.67 - Payroll: \$8,887.70 for a total of \$33,255.37, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

Purchase Order Requests:

- **Snow & Ice:** Selectman Braley so moved the approval of the following purchase orders; a request to pay Sleepers Hardware \$15.50 for bolts, nuts, and tape; a request to pay Napa Auto \$156.00 for bearings and u-joints for truck 9, 10, & 13 and a request to pay Sanel Auto \$704.00 for parts to repair truck 11 & 10, second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.
- **Salt Shed/Maintenance Building:** Selectman Braley made a motion to approve a request to purchase an internet repeater form B&H Photo Video for \$88.19 (trying to get internet to the Maintenance Building), second by Selectman Black and vote unanimous.

Old and New Business:

• **Weekly Update on Selectmen activities:**

Selectman Black mentioned last weekend the furnace broke down here at the Municipal Building and she called someone to fix it.

Selectman Amatrudo gave a special thank you to the Fire Department and 1st Responders for all they have done this week during the heavy rain, winds and power outage.

Selectman Braley mentioned Monday-Tuesday were busy days due to the storm. Stanley Hackett, Emergency Management Director, came in and worked on road closures. There was a fire early Tuesday morning and a thank you went out to the Fire Department for all their hard work.

- **Appointment:** Selectman Black made a motion to appoint Ronald Phinney as a member of the Saco River Corridor Commission for a three year term, November 1, 2017 to November 30, 2020, second by Selectman Amatrudo and vote unanimous.
- **Transfer Station** –Transfer Station will no longer accept brush and yard waste.
- **November 7th Referendum Vote.** Selectman Black reminded all to get out and vote on Tuesday, November 7th.

- **Road Closure Ordinance:** Selectman Braley made a motion accept the 2017-2022 Winter Road Maintenance Closure Ordinance, which closes the following roadways for winter maintenance for five years.
Mill Turn Road from end of pavement to Beaver Berry Road,
Sand Pond Road from Old Hollis Road to Beaver Berry Road,
Beaver Berry Road from Horseshoe Bend Road to Mill Turn Road,
Tucker Road from Tucker Farm to the Sleepy Hollow turn-around. This closure may be adjusted at the turn-around up to 350' upon an approved appropriate size turn-around being installed by property owner.
River Road from end of pavement on route 25 end and from end of pavement on route 11 end,
Second to motion was made by Selectman Amatrudo and vote unanimous.
