Vehicles: Engine 2 is still out of service due a check engine light from 3 codes. We are working to find some place local to have the truck serviced. The truck had new front tires installed on Wednesday, we were informed that it needs an alignment. That has been scheduled for Tuesday the 6th.

Engine 6 is out of service due to a problem with the hand throttle on the pump panel. I have contacted Greenwood Emergency Vehicles the part is on order.

Unit 11 is out of service due to excessive wear on the rear tires. It is scheduled for an alignment on Wednesday the 7th.

Special notes: This April ended 39 calls behind April 2024. There were 8 calls the 1st three days of May, putting us 4 calls ahead MTD over last May. Year to date we are 10 calls Behind last year.

There were three requests for mutual aid assistance this week, 1 call to cover an ems calls in Cornish, 1 request for a Paramedic intercept for Sacopee (we didn't have one available), and 1 call for an ambulance to respond to a fire in Waterboro.



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
